Investment Return Summary

Due to the IPS change in March 2016, periods beginning prior to 3/31/16 do not reflect current investments and are omitted.

The first quarter was an excellent quarter for the Episcopal Diocese fund. During the quarter, the accounts collectively gained 4.47% which is better than both benchmarks. During the quarter we added a new income generation strategy which has been additive to gains. On a dollar basis, the portfolio showed investment gains of \$1,129,000. In addition, the end of the 1st quarter marked the one year anniversary of the new investment strategy. Over the past 12 months, the portfolio gained 9.54%. The Investment Policy Statement target return (i.e. what we were trying to achieve at minimum), posted a 1 year result of 7.38%. We are pleased with excess returns. This is illustrated on page 4.





FAVORABLE	GROWTH	The economy appears to have been mixed, but moderately strong in the first quarter, with some softening in consumer spending growth.
	EMPLOYMENT	Job growth has remained strong, but the pace should slow over time as the labor market tightens further.
	BUSINESS INVESTMENT	Post-election optimism is expected to boost capital spending in the near term, but we'll need to see consumer demand pick up. An improved global economy and a turnaround in energy exploration should also add.

The Policy Effect

Anticipation of Trump administration policy initiatives continues to drive investor confidence, with the expectation a pro-business environment will foster economic growth. Overall, first-quarter gains in the U.S. equity market overshadowed a downturn in the S&P 500 in late March, in response to the Republican majority's inability to pass healthcare legislation. A 1.23% loss on March 21 represented the S&P 500's largest single-day decline since mid-October. Yet, the markets rose again before the quarter ended, with Congress and the White House expected to turn their attentions to tax-reform, trade relations and infrastructure spending. The relationship between the markets and the administration's policy efforts bears watching.

MARKET UPDATE

Amid signs of global economic growth, international equity surged and the U.S. equity rally continued during the first quarter of the year. Anticipation of a more business-friendly environment under the Trump administration fueled U.S. large caps. Investor confidence was unbowed by the U.S. Federal Reserve's commitment to return to a normal interest rate environment, taking in stride a 0.25% increase in the federal funds rate.

EQUITY

Domestic Equity

Seemingly immune to the forces of gravity, the U.S. large cap rally continued. Post-election investor confidence rolled into the new year with continued anticipation for Trump administration policy initiatives aimed at promoting economic growth, as well as positive data regarding unemployment and consumer confidence.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average reached a new high of 20,000 in late January, only to reach another at 21,000 on March 1. For the quarter, domestic large caps returned 6.07%. For comparison, the S&P 500's first-quarter average for the past 25 years was 1.80%. With policy initiatives viewed as being less beneficial to smaller companies, U.S. small- to mid-cap equity returned 3.76%, after posting a return of 17.59% in 2016.

As the U.S. equity rally continues, large cap price-to-earnings valuations are elevated relative to other asset classes. Improved earnings are seemingly priced into the market anew, rather than serving to bring prices and earnings more closely in line. This trend bears watching.



International Equity

For the second time in the past three quarters, international equity outpaced domestic equity, with several nations in Europe and Asia showing positive signs of economic growth. International developed markets returned 7.25%, despite continued uncertainty regarding the United Kingdom's withdrawal from the European Union, a two-year process that officially began on March 29. Likewise, emerging markets large cap equity returned 11.45%, amid continued uncertainty regarding the effects of protectionist policies on developing markets. Improved earnings added momentum to already favorable price-to-earnings valuations in both asset classes, which also benefited from increased currency values.



FIXED INCOME

The U.S. Federal Reserve continued on its course toward interest rate normalization, raising the federal funds rate 0.25% in March, the second such increase in four months. Though the markets were largely unfazed – the previous increase caused a short period of increased volatility – the March increase combined with equity market gains to spell nearly flat returns for investment-grade bonds. Core fixed income returned 0.82%.

Among the highest-returning sectors in the bond market, emerging markets returned 3.87%, and high yield bonds returned 2.70%. Emerging markets fixed income benefited from a weaker dollar, declining inflation in developing economies and favorable credit conditions. High yield bonds returned 17.13% in 2016 and began the new year well, but investor appetite for risk began to decrease considerably in March, when spreads narrowed and oil markets wavered.




ALTERNATIVES

As equity markets forged ahead, alternative investments were outshined. Alternative managers have the flexibility to invest in a variety of markets and can take long or short positions. Since their main mandate is diversification through low volatility relative to equity markets, they tend to have significant exposure to fixed income investments, either directly or through derivative instruments. Given that core fixed income was nearly flat for the quarter, alternatives were only slightly better with a return of 1.58%.

Long/short equity led alternatives with a return of 2.86%, though short opportunities were scarce as global equity markets produced solid gains. Among the few asset classes to post negative returns for the quarter, commodities returned -2.33%. After gaining an impressive 45.03% in 2016, oil lost 5.81% in the first quarter of 2017 as inventory and supply climbed. Gold, which investors consider a hedge against inflation, gained 8.64% as inflationary expectations were boosted by strong global economic growth and continued monetary easing by major international banks.

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FINAL THOUGHTS

Despite ongoing concerns about Brexit and China’s economic transition, the global economic outlook has improved, which is also helpful for the U.S. capital investment outlook. Following an extended period of unusual accommodation, the Fed’s key near-term objective is policy normalization – getting the federal funds rate closer to a long-term equilibrium level (provided conditions are supportive). Global financial conditions appear to have weathered the December and March rate hikes with few disruptions. That suggests that the markets are better able to withstand further rate increases.

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




Asset Allocation



Equity Investment Style %




Fixed-Income Investment Style %









● Portfolio ● Holding ■ B-mark 3-Year Mean





Items to Note Regarding Certain Underlying Securities

A closed-end fund is an investment company, which typically makes one public offering of a fixed number of shares. Thereafter, shares are traded on a secondary market such as the New York Stock Exchange. As a result, the secondary market price may be higher or lower than the closed-end fund's net asset value (NAV). If these shares trade at a price above their NAV, they are said to be trading at a premium. Conversely, if they are trading at a price below their NAV, they are said to be trading at a discount.

An exchange-traded fund (ETF) is an investment company that typically has an investment objective of striving to achieve a similar return as a particular market index. The ETF will invest in either all or a representative sample of the securities included in the index it is seeking to imitate. Like closed-end funds, ETFs can be traded on a secondary market and thus have a market price that may be higher or lower than its net asset value. If these shares trade at a price

A money market fund is an investment company that invests in commercial paper, banker's acceptances, repurchase agreements, government securities, certificates of deposit and other highly liquid securities, and pays money market rates of interest. Scheduled Portfolio Trailing Returns

Scheduled Portfolios are customized by the user to account for loads, taxes, cash flows, and specific investment dates. Scheduled portfolios use the portfolio's investment history to calculate final market values and returns. For scheduled portfolios, both individual holding and portfolio returns are internal-rate-of-return calculations that reflect the timing and dollar size of all purchases and sales. For stocks and mutual funds, sales charges and tax rates are taken into account as specified by the user (except in the pre-tax returns, which reflect the impact of sales charges but not taxes). Note that in some scheduled portfolio illustrations, dividends and capital gains distributions, if applicable, are reinvested at the end of the month in which they are made at the month-end closing price. Unscheduled Portfolio Returns

Monthly total returns for unscheduled portfolios are calculated by applying the ending period holding weightings supplied by the user to an individual holding's monthly returns. When monthly returns are unavailable for a holding (ie. Due to it not being in existence during the historical period being reported), the remaining portfolio holdings are re-weighted to maintain consistent proportions. Inception dates are listed in the Disclosure for Standardized and Tax Adjusted Returns. Trailing returns are calculated by geometrically linking these weighted-average monthly returns. Unscheduled portfolio returns thus assume monthly rebalancing. Returns for individual holdings are simple time-weighted trailing returns. Neither portfolio returns nor holding returns are adjusted for loads or taxes, and if adjusted for, would reduce the returns stated. The returns stated assume the reinvestment of dividends and capital gains. Mutual fund returns include all ongoing fund expenses. VA/VL returns reflect subaccount level fund expenses, including M&E expenses, administration fees, and actual ongoing fund level expenses.

The historic performance data graphed is extrapolated from the ending portfolio value based on the monthly returns.

Benchmark Returns

Benchmark returns may or may not be adjusted to reflect ongoing expenses such as sales charges. An investment's portfolio may differ significantly from the securities in the benchmark.

Returns for custom benchmarks are calculated by applying user-supplied weightings to each benchmark's returns every month. Trailing returns are calculated by geometrically linking these weighted-average monthly returns. Custom benchmark returns thus assume monthly rebalancing.

Standardized Returns

For mutual funds, standardized return is total return adjusted for sales charges, and reflects all ongoing fund expenses. Following this disclosure statement, standardized returns for each portfolio holding are shown.

For money market mutual funds, standardized return is total return adjusted for sales charges and reflects all ongoing fund expenses. Current 7-day yield more closely reflects the current earnings of the money market fund than the total return quotation.

For VA subaccounts, standardized return is total return based on its inception date within the separate account and is adjusted to reflect recurring and non-recurring charges such as surrender fees, contract charges, maximum front-end load, maximum deferred load, maximum M&E risk charge, administration fees, and actual ongoing fund-level expenses.

For ETFs, the standardized returns reflect performance, both at market price and NAV price, without adjusting for the effects of taxation or brokers commissions. These returns are adjusted to reflect all ongoing ETF expenses and assume reinvestment of dividends and capital gains. If adjusted, the effects of taxation would reduce the performance quoted.

The charges and expenses used in the standardized returns are obtained from the most recent prospectus and/or shareholder report available to Morningstar. Investment Style

The Morningstar Style Box combines the various funds investment strategies. For the equity style box, the vertical axis shows the market capitalization of the stocks owned and the horizontal axis shows investment style (value, blend, or growth). For the fixed-income style box, the vertical axis shows the average credit quality of the bonds owned and the horizontal axis shows interest rate sensitivity as measured by a bond's duration (short, intermediate, or long).

Risk and Return

Standard deviation is a statistical measure of the volatility of a portfolio's returns around its mean.

Sharpe ratio uses a portfolio's standard deviation and total return to determine reward per unit of risk.

Alpha measures the difference between a portfolio's actual returns and its expected performance, given its beta and the actual returns of the benchmark index. Alpha is often seen as a measurement of the value added or subtracted by a portfolio's manager.

Beta is a measure of the degree of change in value one can expect in a portfolio given a change in value in a benchmark index. A portfolio with a beta greater than one is generally more volatile than its benchmark index, and a portfolio with a beta of less than one is generally less volatile than its benchmark index.

R-squared reflects the percentage of a portfolio's movements that are explained by movements in its benchmark index, showing the degree of correlation between the portfolio and a benchmark. This figure is also helpful in assessing how likely it is that alpha and beta are statistically significant.

Fundamental Analysis

The below referenced data elements are a weighted average of the equity holdings in the portfolio.

The median market capitalization of a subaccount's equity portfolio gives you a measure of the size of the companies in which the subaccount invests.

The Price/Cash Flow ratio is a weighted average of the price/cash-flow ratios of the stocks in a subaccount's portfolio. Price/cash-flow shows the ability of a business to generate cash and acts as a gauge of liquidity and solvency.

The Price/Book ratio is a weighted average of the price/book ratios of all the stocks in the underlying fund's portfolio. The P/B ratio of a company is calculated by dividing the market price of its stock by the company's per-share book value. Stocks with negative book values are excluded from this calculation.

The Price/Earnings ratio is a weighted average of the price/earnings ratios of the stocks in the underlying fund's portfolio. The P/E ratio of a stock is calculated by dividing the current price of the stock by its trailing 12 months' earnings per share. In computing the average, Morningstar weights each portfolio holding by the percentage of equity assets it represents.

The Price/Sales ratio is a weighted average of the price/sales ratios of the stocks in the underlying fund's portfolio. The P/S ratio of a stock is calculated by dividing the current price of the stock by its trailing 12 months' revenues per share. In computing the average, Morningstar weights each portfolio holding by the percentage of equity assets it represents.

The return on assets (ROA) is the percentage a company earns on its assets in a given year. The calculation is net income divided by end-of-year total assets, multiplied by 100.

The Return on Equity (ROE) is the percentage a company earns on its shareholders' equity in a given year. The calculation is net income divided by end-of-year net worth, multiplied by 100.

Market Maturity shows the percentage of a holding's common stocks that are domiciled in developed and emerging markets.

The below referenced data elements listed below are a weighted average of the fixed income holdings in the portfolio.

The average credit quality is derived by taking the weighted average of the credit rating for each bond in the portfolio.

Average maturity is used for holdings in the taxable fixed-income category, this is a weighted average of all the maturities of the bonds in a portfolio, computed by weighting each maturity date by the market value of the security. Credit quality breakdowns are shown for corporate-bond holdings and depicts the quality of bonds in the underlying portfolio. The analysis reveals the percentage of fixed-income securities that fall within each credit-quality rating as assigned by Standard & Poor's or Moody's. (debt). This figure is not provided for financial companies.

Debt as a percentage of capital is calculated by dividing long-term debt by total capitalization (the sum of common equity plus preferred equity plus long-term debt). This figure is not provided for financial companies.

Duration is a time measure of a bond's interest-rate sensitivity.

Net Margin is a measure of profitability. It is equal to annual net income divided by revenues from the same period for the past five fiscal years, multiplied by 100.

Type Weightings divide the stocks in a given holding's portfolio into eight type designations each of which defines a broad category of investment characteristics. Not all stocks in a given holding's portfolio are assigned a type. These stocks are grouped under NA.

The below referenced data elements listed below are a weighted average of the total holdings in the portfolio.

The average expense ratio is the percentage of assets deducted each year for operating expenses, management fees, and all other asset-based costs incurred by the fund, excluding brokerage fees. Please note for mutual funds, variable annuities/life, ETF and closed-end funds we use the gross prospectus ratio as provided in the prospectus. For separate accounts and stocks we pull the audited expense ratio from the annual report.

Potential capital gains exposure is the percentage of a holding's total assets that represent capital appreciation.
